# SEEING IS BEE-LIEVING

Onancock in a section of a circa 1883 house, lived tens of thousands of European immigrants.

The Italians set up shop about 10 years ago. They worked hard, were loyal to their queen and mostly ignored the other house occupants who were the fourth and fifth generation of Eastern Shore folks to live in the colonial structure and likewise paid little attention to the squatters.

No one else in the town seemed to notice the dense population either. After all, it was a fairytale scene in a picturesque neighborhood, complete with a recently erected picket fence. That is until more renovations forced the homesteaders to be evicted.

We're talking bees here. A colony of them had a honey factory in the roof of Janet and Fletcher Fosque's front porch. A worker making repairs to the house got stung. The bees needed to be moved in order for the porch to be fixed. So last Friday, along came Paul Young (also known as the Bee Whisperer) to smoke them out and vacuum them up. And while he did it, he taught the bystanders (or in this case, roofstanders) a lesson about honey and its makers.

He toted an electric machine (that looked like a cross between a steel paint gun and a tin oil can), fired it with wood pellets and burlap, and sprayed smoke at the bees.

"They think the woods are on fire," Young said, adding of the buzz, "You hear the activity? That's because they're in a feeding frenzy. They gorge themselves so when they go to a new location, they'll have wax for a new comb."

Young managed to save 99 percent of the more than 60,000 bees. He carried them in a box of honeycombs to Bloxom, where he and his wife, Chris, have 50 other hives that produce about a ton of raw honey each year.

"Tve always had an affinity for bees," said Janet Fosque as she leaned out an upstairs window to watch as roof timbers were pulled back to expose the operation. Her maiden name is Beazley, which she said means "the man who kept the bees."

Young has removed bees for people for about 3½ decades. Several years ago, he got a hive from up the street at Colonial Manor Bed & Breakfast. Another colony of Italian descent built its home there inside a dead cedar's hollow center. It was between eight to ten feet long

and five or six combs across. The deteriorating tree was threatening electric lines and the bees were found.

Young accidentally got involved in keeping bees when a swarm showed up at a neighbor's house in Baltimore. He went to a local expert for help and wound up buying some equipment for \$5. Not really knowing what he was doing, he kept shaking bees into a hive. "I took them home and that was the start. I've had bees ever since. I came down here (to the Eastern Shore) with nine hives. It's just built up every year."

Now the simple box used to collect the bees costs about \$350.

Young's been stung about 50 times. Most Italian bees (Continued on Page 5)

## New EMS Facility Moves Closer to Reality

The Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Department of Northampton County soon may receive a facelift.

On the table is a recommendation to establish a permanent facility to house the EMS Department, including its two first-response units, as well as the new ambulance that has arrived and is expected to be operational in April.

If approved by the Board of Supervisors, the new facility will make use of a portion of the former Northampton Middle School. A garage area that could house four or more vehicles would be built adjacent to the structure.

Northampton's EMS Department, created about 20 years ago, staffs units owned by volunteer rescue agencies in Bayview and Exmore, as well as its central site in a rented structure in Machipongo.

As proposed, the new facility would cost \$1,036,437.

The supervisors agreed to the proposal in concept, but delayed a formal vote, which may come later this month.

In other business, County Administrator Katie Nunez reviewed the proposed FY 2012 budget with the supervisors. Nunez noted, "It looks as though the current budget does provide signs of positive movement of our revenues. While we are not expecting a rapid increase in the revenue stream, we feel that there are signs of rebound locally, especially in the areas of solid waste and building renovation permits."

She noted that one challenge to the budget will be the impact from the state budget with regards to local aid, especially in the areas of education and the constitutional officers.

Additionally, effective July 1, locali-

# Saxis Church Finds Salvation

There's another fire coming to an Accomack island town, but this time instead of being devastated, people will be celebrating the flame and its satisfying glow.

Yes, members of Saxis United Methodist Church

are getting ready to party. They're still counting their blessings and thanking those who made it possible. They've come a long way in the last 11 years.

The mortgage on their new place of worship was paid off in December 2009 and they're finally getting around to celebrating with a "Note Burning" Service at 11 a.m. Sunday, April 10. Every-

one is invited. District Superintendent Tammy Estep will be guest speaker and lunch will be provided.

Many remember April 4, 2000, when smoke billowed through the town and flames could be seen darting out of the historic 111-year-old church. Dozens of firefighters worked for hours trying to salvage what they could of the building and its contents. The blaze, caused by an electrical malfunction, destroyed the church.

"It was a sad time, I can tell you that," said Sherrye

Lewis, the congregation's treasurer, who's been going to this church all her life. "Everybody was so good all over the Shore. You don't want to name anybody because you'd leave somebody out."

The next day, just after 17 of 20 pews were brought out of the charred building, a loud popping noise was

> heard and the roof collapsed. Also saved were the church's altar table and Bible, the Sunday School bell and the larger bell that rang in the old church tower, along with some of the stained-glass windows.

The congregation raised money by holding auctions, pizza parties, concerts, ice cream socials and banana split events. They sold bricks from the old structure. One woman


sold pretty glass ornaments she made from the remaining stained glass. Wooden church replicas and etched glass rounds were put up for sale.

"The first Sunday, we all went to the (Saxis) fire hall" for services, said Lewis. Then Saxis Wesleyan Church let them use its sanctuary. "Our (service) was in the morning. Theirs was in the afternoon," said Lewis. "People were very good to us. A lot of other churches gave."

On the day of the fire, people were crying in the

streets at the sight of the charred landmark where they were baptized, married and held funeral services for their loved ones. It was a breezy day; the winds fed the flames. In the previous months, the town had suffered other tragedies. Hurricane Floyd had wreaked havoc, watermen saw young crabs mysteriously die and a young local man was killed in a hunting accident. Through the grief came a renewed effort to see another church get built.

Court records show Taylor is a selfemployed carpenter who was on probation or patrol. Previous convictions include uttering, petty larceny, grand larceny and felony hit and run.


Police are looking for a Maryland man accused of robbing an Accomac convenience store last December, according to Godwin. His alleged accomplice is being held in Wicomico County

the nuclear power plant in Japan, several EPA air monitors have detected very low levels of radioactive material in the U.S.," says State Health Commissioner Karen Remley, MD, MBA, FAAP. "To date, none of Virginia's multiple monitoring systems has detected a level of radioac-

tive material that would pose a publichealth concern.

"Recent reports of elevated levels of radioactive material in rainwater in Pennsylvania and Massachusetts have been expected, since radiation is known to travel in the atmosphere." adds Dr. Remley. "However, we are not seeing that in any of the monitoring

data for the state."

In addition to the Virginia Department of Health's (VDH's) routine radiological monitoring, extensive routine monitoring is already being done in Virginia by the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency), Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Dominion Virginia Power, and U.S. Military.

VDH is also regularly advising the secretary of Health and Human Resources and the Governor's Office on the status of monitoring and levels of radiation detected.

Although short-term elevations such as these do not raise public health concerns and are expected to be relatively short in duration, VDH is taking the following steps to resolve any concerns here in Virginia.

 VDH was scheduled to conduct routine quarterly radiological health division monitoring and is moving up that schedule by one week to begin on

Monday, March 28. This routine monitoring checks radiation levels in air, drinking water, vegetation and milk at multiple sites throughout the state.

. VDH is working with the state's laboratory to implement the proposed baseline testing plan for rainwater. drinking water, vegetation and milk. Further testing will follow as indicated, based upon results of the baseline testing and ongoing monitoring. This is not a new protocol, but a standard VDH response when routine monitoring indicates a need to test further.

 VDH is advising residents that the state's drinking water supplies remain safe, but reminds Virginians out of an abundance of caution that they should avoid using rainwater collected in cisterns as drinking water.

 VDH is continuing to coordinate with federal and state partners to assure the safety and health of Virginians.

are usually quite docile, he said, but not always, and he's come across more aggressive colonies of other lineage.

Once a barge arrived in Pocomoke with a swarm of Africanized bees that had stowed away. Young said anyone within 200 feet of them got stung. They were finally subdued by introducing a Russian queen to the hive.

The African bees all died off at the end of their short natural life cycle and the remaining hive was added to Young's apiary. The bees from those 50 Bloxom hives get to gather pollen from acres of buckwheat and turnip greens planted especially for them. At right,

## Truck Smashes Into Restaurant


A tractor-trailer loaded with cases of frozen chicken leg quarters ran off Lankford Highway in Melfa early Wednesday morning, striking two telephone poles and two cars before landing in Don Valerio's Restaurant, where if left a gapping hole in the concrete block wall.

The driver, Tony Terrell Weeks, 41, of Mappsville, suffered minor injuries, according to Sgt. Michelle Anaya of the State Police. The restaurant had closed hours earlier and no one was inside. Both cars, which were smashed and destroyed, were unoccupied and parked in a nearby used car lot.

Anaya said the accident occurred at about 12:50 a.m. when the southbound 2005 Freightliner tractor-trailer ran off the road to the right. After striking the two cars, the truck dragged one with it and slung the other into a pole. The tractor-trailer finally hit the restaurant. An estimate of damages was not available.

Weeks was wearing his seat belt. Anaya said alcohol was not a factor. Workers preparing to unload the truck said the chicken was not salvageable. The restaurant manager said six employees would be out of work.

Cheriton By Ron West

Cheriton Town
Council conducted
a public hearing
last week to receive
input on proposed
updates to the town
ordinances.

Resident R.L. Carpenter commented on Council's interest in hiring a police officer. He questioned the need for such a move and expressed concern over the officer's duties. In particular, Carpenter asked if the officer would be enforcing traffic laws along the highway and how much time he or she would spend in the business area of town. He questioned the need versus the cost of employing and equipping someone to enforce the town codes.

Council agreed to delay a formal vote on the revised town codes until its April meeting.

Council briefly discussed ongoing efforts to reach an agreement with the county over a boundary adjustment. Town Clerk Stacy Salenski stated that she has received a substantial number of responses from the surveys regarding such a move. She said that the vast majority of the property owners who have replied express strong support for expansion of the town's boundaries.

ties will be responsible for fees associated with the Line of Duty Act. The Line of Duty Act provides benefits for professional and volunteer police, fire and rescue personnel who are killed or disabled in the line of duty. Nunez said the cost locally is \$23,712, but is projected to increase by four times that amount within the next three years. According to Nunez, the towns of Exmore, Eastville, and Cape Charles, which have police departments, must assume the fee for their employees, but the language of the change does not clarify responsibilities for volunteer fire and rescue departments. The fee is basically an insurance premium to cover payouts required by law under the plan. Payouts to survivors from the state, as well as the federal Line of Duty Act, can exceed \$400,000.

The supervisors discussed possible fees and taxes that might bring in additional revenues for the county. On the plus side, it was reported that the county will receive \$3,116,112 from the state in relation to the regional jail

construction cost. The county will use the funds to offset its debt obligations.

The supervisors briefly discussed a request by Bayshore Concrete to consider reducing the Machinery and Tools Tax Rate for FY2012. One option would be to change it to the fee paid for farm equipment in the county. Supervisor Samuel Long Jr. asked for a list of the top businesses that pay the Machinery and Tools Tax to review the financial impact of making such a change.






To make the list, students must be enrolled full-time and have a grade-point average of 3.4 or higher, with no grade below C.




## Joyce Marshall To Wed Melvin Rowley







Though I have lived on the Shore longer than anywhere else, I find that I still consider myself a "visitor." Guess it's all the emphasis around these parts on "come-heres." If not me, then who?

It is fascinating to me that my children, of course, consider their hometown to be here on the Shore. And it must be true — Facebook says so.

I imagine my situation to be something like immigrants whose children are citizens while they are not.




